



Squad Leader Responsibilities

1. Work in connection with your Street Coordinator.
2. Be a participant in all small group Squad Leader Meetings
3. Get instructions for each day's activities from the Street Coordinator.
4. Meet with your Group Leaders during breakfast or at an appropriate time.
 - Make sure your Group Leaders understand their assignments for the day.
 - You are responsible for the training for the day's activities (you are not required to do the training as one of your leaders may be more gifted in that area than you are). Get to know your leaders!
 - There may be no "special training" leaders, so you will need to meet with your leaders to determine who will do the training for the day.
 - For clown training, have all your leaders to demonstrate the clown skits and the "Heart" song.
5. Let your Group Leaders know you are there to assist them, but not to run their groups. After your group meeting with your leaders, you are now in a position of counsel and not of authority. You are there to know and meet the needs of your Group Leaders.
6. You must be on the street, visible for each group at some point during the day.
7. If you have an Assistant Squad Leader, your main task is to train your Assistant Squad Leader so that he will be able to be a future Squad Leader.
8. Ensure you review our Small Group Evaluations during the trip to understand how your Group Leaders will evaluate your leadership.
